# **IMPORTANT - checklist for your child's stay with us**

We have enclosed a checklist for parents and carers to follow in preparation for your child's stay with us. It's really important to bring your child's toiletries and slings, as they have been tailored to your child's needs.

# **Advocacy support service**

We have previously sent you information about our Advocacy Support Service, which you can access as a parent of a child using our service. The service provides free advice on issues such as welfare benefits, personal budgets, assessments and care plans, housing, employment disputes, and more.

We've had really positive feedback about the service but unfortunately we haven't had any appointments booked for the September and November dates. If appointments are not booked, we risk losing external funding and will no longer be able to offer the clinics. Please let us know if you would like some help so we can arrange dates for 2019.

### A new service for young adults coming soon

We're really pleased to have recently been given funding from Together for Short Lives to further support young adults living with complex and unmet needs, who are transitioning in to adult services. We are one of eight projects in the UK to be given funding through the 'Improving Transitions for Young People Fund.'

The money will allow St Oswald's to pilot an annual assessment clinic for young adults and facilitate closer working relationships between the Hospice and GPs.
