This winter, Light up a Life will return to celebrate the lives of loved ones we miss. As well as dedicating a light on our tree and attending a celebration of life event in person or from home (see enclosed leaflet for more information) this year you can also create a lasting online tribute that will keep your loved one's memory alive all year round. Light up a Life... a Place to Remember is somewhere you can use privately for messages and reflections or share with friends and family for remembrance and celebration. We hope it will bring you and loved ones comfort as you remember the good times, mark anniversaries, share silly moments or simply be a safe place to turn to when things feel tough.

Michael and Kelly from Northumberland chose to remember their beloved sister Joanne by setting up a Light up a Life... a Place to Remember page in her memory.

Kelly said:

"Joanne is still a huge part of our family. We have kept her number in our family group chats and I send her messages when I have something I want to tell her. She's included in everything we do. We get together often as a family and when we do, Joanne is always talked about, as we share stories and memories. We still tag her in our Facebook posts. I can't see us ever not, to be honest."

Michael added:

"When Joanne died her children really struggled. I told her son Matthew, that just because he can't see her, it doesn't mean she's not there. I said that anytime he felt proud of something he has achieved or was having a down day or needed to get something off his chest to just text her and tell her. I hope and pray that wherever she is, she will somehow see the messages and know how much we love and miss her.

"Setting up a memory page gives our whole family a somewhere we can all go to share our photos, memories and messages to Joanne. It's a real comfort to us all."

Personalised care when it's needed most...

Our brand new Combined Supportive Care Service has launched at St Oswald's Hospice Focus on Living Centre.

Led by Dr Felicity Dewhurst and Jenny Welford (an Occupational Therapist from Newcastle Hospitals), this weekly service is a collaboration between St Oswald's Hospice and Newcastle Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

Patients with lung cancer or mesothelioma are referred by their hospital care team, so that they can get any additional care, support and treatment needs met by a multi-disciplinary team, all in one place – when they need it most.

Living with these cancers (and any other conditions they may have as well), comes with many challenges – from physical symptoms or side-effects to the impact on emotional wellbeing and mental health.

The service aims to help manage those challenges in the best way possible, reduce the risk of hospital admission and improve quality of life.

Meet June...

"I was so pleased that I could get so many things done at one place because my mobility is not very good. It's on my mind all the time 'oh, how will I do that?' But it's good because I can get so many things done here all at once. I feel the freedom to ask for what I need. They make you feel belonging and comfortable – the staff are all so nice. They really are – from the first one to the last one that you meet, even the driver who brings me in!"

Communication is key

In April, Diane Nicholson, Sister from the Children and Young Adults Service, started an exciting secondment as a Practitioner Research Fellow*.

Over two years, Diane is researching 'Augmentative and Alternative Communication (A.A.C)' and hopes to improve communication between staff and the children and young adults who come for Short Breaks at St Oswald's Hospice.


A.A.C. is a range of strategies and tools to help people who struggle with speech, including for example using Makaton (language programme using symbols, signs and speech). Diane is one of only 20 people in the UK currently carrying out research around Paediatric Palliative Care. We wish her lots of luck and will keep you updated with how the research is progressing.
