Aims:

This role will support the successful execution of strategy and development projects following the full project lifecycle, from initiation and planning to execution and evaluation.

When / Where:

A minimum of half day or more per week at St Oswald's Hospice, Regent Avenue Gosforth, Newcastle upon Tyne NE3 1EE

Plus, a minimum of 4-5 hours per week training (200 hours in total) at Pitman Training Centre, 2 Collingwood Street, Newcastle upon Tyne NEI 1JF where you will be supported by the Pitman Training Staff.

Main Tasks:

- Assist in project coordination, supporting project managers in meeting key milestones.
- Track project progress, update schedules, and ensure documentation is maintained.
- Assist in project reporting, including collecting and analysing data to support decision-making.
- Participate in meetings, take minutes, and follow up on action points.
- Contribute to process improvement initiatives within the organisation.

Skills and Experience:

- Interest in project management, administration, or business operations.
- Strong organisational skills with attention to detail.



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- Ability to communicate effectively with different stakeholders.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office applications, particularly Word, Excel, Outlook, and Teams.
